Tallest Sunflower Contest

Important Reminders for Dog Owners

- Dogs must be restrained when outside the property limits of its owner.
- It is a public nuisance for any person to own, keep, or harbor any dog which excessively barks, howls, growls or makes other disturbing noises.
- Dog waste must be cleaned up promptly and is not allowed on public property. This includes public property such as, sidewalks, trails, parks, etc.

HELP KEEP EAGLE LAKE LOOKING ITS BEST

Notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the city of Eagle Lake to cut and/or spray all weeds and grass taller than 6 inches. Noxious weeds and grass taller than 6 inches are considered a nuisance. If a property owner fails to control weeds on their property, the city may cut the nuisance weeds and bill the owner for the work done.

Maintaining the quality and appearance of homes and property is important because it enhances community livability and keeps property values high. To help keep Eagle Lake looking its best, residents' help is needed. When yards and boulevards are not maintained, it becomes a nuisance for everyone. Your help is needed to ensure Eagle Lake's quality of life.

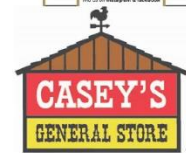
