UPCOMING EVENTS

FALL CLEAN UP: The fall clean up will be held on Saturday, October 20th from 8:00 a.m.-noon at Lake Eagle Park. The clean up is open to Eagle Lake residents only. Please bring along a valid ID for proof of residence. Acceptable waste: general garbage, electronics that don't have video display devices, furniture (including bed, couch, recliner, etc.), pedal bikes, grill without propane tank, and other like items. No hazardous materials will be accepted.

LEAF PICK UP: The fall leaf pick up will begin on Monday, October 29th. The leaf pick up will continue until the entire city has been collected. This cycle will repeat until snow falls. When possible, please remove any parked cars from the street until the leaves have been collected on your street. This allows for a more efficient leaf pick up. Leaf piles should only contain leaves. Leaves should be placed in the boulevard for pick up. **PLEASE DO NOT RAKE LEAVES INTO THE STREET.**

2019 BUDGET PROCESS

The preliminary budget and property tax levy for 2019 was set at the September 17th City Council Continuation meeting. A Truth-N-Taxation public hearing has been scheduled for 6:00 p.m. on Monday, December 3rd in the Council Chambers at Eagle Lake City Hall. If necessary, a continuation hearing will take place at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, December 10th at the same location. A copy of the budget is available upon request at City Hall.

Snow Emergency Parking Regulations – Section 4.100 of City Code

- A. Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the term "Emergency" shall mean any condition upon any public street, including the presence of snow, freezing rain, sleet, ice or other phenomenon, which condition creates or is likely to create any hazardous road condition or impedes or is likely to impede the free movement of traffic, when such conditions have been declared by the Public Works Director or in his absence, the on duty Maintenance Worker.
- B. Declaration. Upon the existence of an emergency as defined herein, the Public Works Director or in his absence, the on-duty Maintenance Worker, declares that an emergency exists, whereupon such person shall notify any radio stations KTOE, KYSM and KEEZ and request that such media cooperate with the City in giving notice to such emergency to the community. The emergency regulations set forth below shall become effective one (1) hour after such notice has been given by the City to such news media.
- C. Unlawful Acts. During an emergency, it is unlawful for any person, as driver or operator of a vehicle, or as the registered owner of such vehicle, to park, stop or leave standing, or cause, allow, or permit to be parked, stopped or left standing, whether knowingly or unknowingly, any such vehicle upon any City street until the snow emergency has been lifted.
- D. Towing. Upon the existence of an emergency as defined above, the City may tow vehicles in violation of this ordinance as authorized in Minnesota State Statute 169.041.
