



2020 Fall Cleanup Information
Saturday, September 26th
8AM-Noon, Lake Eagle Park

An announcement was made in late March that the annual curbside spring cleanup was suspended due to COVID-19 and health and safety concerns. LJP Waste Solutions indicated at that time that a fall curbside cleanup would be held if deemed safe to do so in the fall. Per a recent communication from LJP Waste Solutions, **the fall cleanup will be held at Lake Eagle Park on Saturday, September 26th from 8:00 a.m. until noon.** There will not be curbside pickup offered due to health and safety concerns related to COVID-19.

Important Changes: Due to health and safety concerns related to COVID-19, LJP Waste Solutions requires self-unloading of materials. If you need help unloading items, you must bring someone with you to help unload your items for disposal. Due to increasing processing costs, LJP Waste Solutions will no longer be accepting mattresses.

Regular Refuse.....No Charge
Couches, carpet, chairs, tables, dried out paint cans, grills without propane/gas tank, windows, fiberglass tub, etc. All items should be boxed, bagged, or contained in some manner.

Unacceptable Waste

Unacceptable waste includes such waste that would likely pose a threat to health, safety, and/or the environment. Unacceptable waste may include hazardous waste of any kind or nature such as explosives, radioactive materials, cleaning fluids, crankcase oils, paints, acids, caustics, poisons, pesticides or drugs, pathological or biological waste, sanitary sewage and other highly diluted water carried material substances, human or animal waste, sludge, including sewage sludge and septic and cesspool pump outs; human and animal remains, solvents, liquid waste, street sweepings, mining waste, incinerator residue, transformers, batteries, aerosol cans, trees, demolition debris, ashes, foundry sand, concrete rubble, rock, gravel, construction debris, grass clippings, shrubs, plants, tree limbs, leaves, motor oil, motor filters, fluorescent lights, incandescent light bulbs, cement, or asphalt. Please note that mattresses and box springs are now a special item that must be disposed of by the resident
