Business

1. Pickle Ball Court Improvements Planned for 2019

- Brian Goettl reported that anchors have been purchased and new nets will be purchased. City staff will clean the court floor and tape the boundary lines. Staff will explore pricing to resurface the courts in 2020. Staff will look into caulk to repair cracks in court temporarily.
- Once courts are ready the city could look into the possibility of being added to the Community Ed pickleball program and possibly using the elementary school gym in the winter.

2. Need for Park in Eagle Heights (Jackie Schweim)

- Jackie Schweim stated the city has talked about a neighborhood park in the Eagle Heights development previously. There are about 60 kids from age 16 and on down in this development. Ms. Schweim shared a map of vacant lots in development and asked what the park board would want from residents to move forward.
- It was stated that at this time the city needs to determine community needs to determine best location
- A potential lot was presented with a sale price of \$44,000.

3. Rec on the GO! (Michelle Sorenson with Mankato Community Education and Recreation (CER))

- Seth, Michelle, and Melanie with Community Ed and Melanie, Michelle were present via speaker phone.
- With this program vehicles would be brought to local parks and provide programming, activities, crafts, games thus eliminating transportation concerns for parents and makes it easier for kids to attend.
- A trailer would be brought to Eagle Lake and there would be no cost for equipment.
- The goal is to provide a no cost activity for participants.

- The City would pay for cost of staff at \$10 per hour and the city can determine the number of hours per day, the number of days a week, and staffing need.
- Community Ed would make flyers to distribute to residents.
- Program would be geared for children grades kindergarten through grade 8 and would look at possible preschool programming as well.
- The Board discussed the idea of hosting one morning and one late afternoon/early evening each week.
- A possible budget for this 10-week season was discussed with \$1,000 being determined as appropriate.

4. Outdoor Movies Planned for 2019 (Mankato CER Staff)

- Mankato CER are combining Mankato and Eagle Lake to offer two events this summer, June 14th at Tourtellot and Sept 6th in Eagle Lake. Instead of using the Eagle Lake park this will be held at the elementary school. Eagle Lake's movie will be *Cloudy with a chance of Meatballs*
- Sponsors are being recruited at this time.
- Family events will begin at 7:00 p.m. with a bounce house and concessions. The goal is to generate funds to provide at no cost.
- The city will look into finding a food sponsor for the Eagle Lake event. The estimated food cost is \$300.
- Ideas for food sponsors was discussed.

5. Eagle Lake Expos – Immediate and Future Ballfield Needs

- This will be discussed at the next Park Board meeting.

6. Other

- Winter fest activity of sledding, barrels with fire pits, serve hot chocolate as discussed.
- Holiday Train – staff will keep pursuing bring the holiday train to Eagle Lake

Business

1. Review Email from Eagle Lake Expos

- Immediate and future needs presented via email from Nate Gibson of the Expos were discussed.
- Issues included desire for grandstand on the hill.
- City Council has reviewed email and does not want to make changes.
- Park Board discussion included wanting to know how invested the Expos are in Eagle Lake. What portion of upgrades are they willing to financially and how do they compensate the cost they are asking the city to incur?
- Public Works Director Goettl indicated the large bleachers can be moved to the baseball field, the city does have green temporary fencing that could be installed.
- Administrator Bromeland stated she will let the Expos know that the City Council will repair the score board and that there is a new score board control in the shed.

2. Eagle Heights Park Discussion Follow Up

- The lot previously mentioned that would be available in this area would not be subject to any price breaks for a park.
- Director Goettl stated there are safety requirements which will need to be followed as well as needing to be handicap accessible.
- Discussion included the desire to look to the future and where the best location for a park, taking into consideration future needs. Also discussed was the possibility of slowing the speed on Agency Street, could be slowed down. This project comes down to funding and the city recognizes the need.
- Administrator Bromeland will explore if "Rec on the Go" could possibly host a couple of days in this neighborhood.

3. Soccer Goal Frame Improvement - Frazee Park

- Director Goettl stating purchasing soccer goal frames is expensive and that Public Works is in the process of making new frames out of heavy duty pvc.

4. Timeline for Pickle Ball Court Improvements

- New tennis nets and basketball nets have been ordered.
- City staff will clean tennis court.
- Anchors will be used for pickleball net and net will be able to be pulled.
- Pickleball lines will be painted.
- Pricing will be researched to resurface courts in next couple of years.

5. Recap of Recent LMCIT Workshop and Park Recommendations

- Director Goettl stated that he attended a League of MN Cities safety and loss control meeting and that the League will do an inspection.
- One of biggest changes is that pea rock is no longer to be used in playgrounds, instead safety wood chips, rubber wood chips or rubber matting should be used. The City will need to make this change.
- With ADA requirements a walk way to the playground equipment, go off of pavilion, will need to be added.
- A future goal for Lake Eagle Park is to redo the parking closer to the swings and well house so that people could drive down and park and to include a handicap stall in this area.

6. Upcoming Recreation Activities in Eagle Lake

- a. T-Ball (Jeremy Horkey) - registrations are coming in and six (6) local sponsors have been obtained. League season runs from May 11 – June 13, 2019 and the price is \$20 per child, ages 4-6.
- b. A family friendly Kick ball tournament to be held on the school grounds is being planned for Tator Days as is a softball tournament at ballfield.
- c. REC ON THE GO! – dates are still being scheduled.
- d. Outdoor Movie Event – Held in September in Eagle Lake. There are only 2 locations Turtle lot park and Eagle Lake scheduled for 2019. The movie in Eagle Lake will be *Cloudy with a Change of Meatballs*. Sport Pix will provide banners at both events.

7. Programming Ideas

- Board Members discussed the desire to get community members engaged. Board Members were asked to come up with inexpensive programming ideas.
- Discussed was the possibility of using the City's website calendar to post community activities such as group runs, workout bike rides, etc. and emailing residents of any future events.
- New City and Park signs are ready and will be placed close to current locations.
- Frisbee golf area is too wet at this point and maps need to be made.
- Needed work on the Adventure Park was discussed.
- Flowers will be purchased for the circle garden. Staff would like to build more flower pots for the park.

5. Other

Business

1. Welcome to New Park Board Member Ryan Wersal

- Ryan Wersal provided his background and stated he is a professor at MSU in biology and his interest in serving on the park board includes the desire to make the pond in the Lake Eagle Park as healthy as possible. He also stated his family's passion is archery.

2. Eagle Heights Subdivision

a. Community Survey

- Discussion included the need to survey the residents of Eagle Height development to determine their desires and expectations for a citywide park in that development and to gauge what they envision for park equipment if a park is constructed. If park is desired, then the entire community needs to be surveyed.

b. Update on Lot Purchase

- A purchase agreement has been signed with the closing scheduled for June 30, 2019. Purchase price for lot is \$44,900. Discussion included the cost of the land could be used for improvements to existing parks.

c. General Discussion

- Jeremy Horkey stated he knows of a potential donor interested in donating specifically for park needs who would like to see equipment and cost before making donation.
- Develop long- and short-term strategic planning for all park development and maintenance, assess each park for current needs.
- The possibility of partnering with Pepsi to help fund park improvements was discussed; Pepsi's logo could replace Coke's logo on the scoreboard. MAYBA also has funds available for such improvements.
- The Park Board can review the plan MSU students compiled. A digital document will be emailed to park board members.
- Beth Rohich, a resident of the Eagle Height's subdivision, stated there are many children in the development and that a park in the neighborhood would be good, but there are also negatives to having a park such as traffic and parking and that she would like to make sure that all residents understand the pros and cons prior to the development of a park. There is concern that some residents may be under the impression that a park in this development would be solely for the developments use. It would be a community wide park if installed.

3. Mission Mankato Service Request

- Epiphany Church's pastor has contacted the city stating area churches are planning a mission trip and that youth attending have been asked to complete service projects and is wondering if there are any service projects the youth could assist the city with on July 29-31.
- Possible areas identified included spreading wood chips in adventure park and painting of hockey rink.

4. Rec on the GO! Kickoff Event at Lake Eagle Park: June 19th

- The Park Board was asked to help serve food at this event which runs from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m.

5. Outdoor Movie: September 6th at Eagle Lake Elementary

- Park Board member were asked to be aware of the date of this event.

6. Other Items Discussed

- The possibility of installing colored lights on with the fountain in Lake Eagle Park.
- Putting more lights along the path.
- Utilizing the hill behind the baseball field to construct a terraced earth seating area.

2. Eagle Heights Subdivision – Review Draft Survey Results
 - The initial results of the neighborhood park survey showed mixed opinions for an area park. Overall survey results indicated there is no need for restrooms or a shelter and that green space only, is not desired.
 - Beth Rohrich stated she will abstain from voting on this issue since she is building a home in the Eagle Heights development.
 - Discussion included how park property lines would be known to park users, parking concerns and the concern that children will cut across yards while playing in and accessing the park. The Park Board asked if this parcel is made into a park could the park be relocated if future development warrants a better location. Staff will look into this and respond to the Park Board.
 - What type of playground equipment to install was discussed, as well as the need to be handicap accessibility.
 - Public Works Director Brian Goettl will provide park equipment books to the Park Board members to review for equipment ideas and pricing. Once potential equipment is identified the Board would like to ask the company to help develop a park design plan.
 - The dirt may need to be leveled to develop this parcel for a park.
 - Discussion of possible ways to raise funds for park equipment was discussed which included contacting the Eagle Lake Community Development Foundation, SMIF, the Eagle Lake Area Lions Club, and the Eagle Lake Fire Department. It was also asked if people could make monetary donations for park equipment. Grant opportunities should also be explored.
 - The Park Board asked if the city's website could be used to let residents know what the next steps are in this potential project.
 - Easements relating to the gas line on this parcel need to be identified in relation to designing of the park.
 - If a fence is determined to be needed it could be a phase two project.
3. Alternative Meeting Date or Time Discussion
 - Park Board discussed and decided to change the meeting date and time for the Park Board to the second Thursday of the month at 6:45 a.m. beginning in August of 2019.

4. Strategic Plan
 - Discussion included setting visions and goals and determining the 2019 budget.
 - Items the Park Board would like to consider included maintaining Lake Eagle's pond aesthetically, the pavilion, and resurfacing tennis courts.
5. Mission Mankato Service Request
 - The Public Works department will assist youth with the painting of the hockey rink.
6. Ideas for Eagle Scout Looking for Service Project
 - Let staff know if you have ideas for an Eagle Scout project.
7. T-Ball and Tator Days Activities Update
 - Jeremy Horkey stated the season is wrapping up this Saturday and that 66 children from Eagle Lake and several surrounding communities participated.
 - There will be a softball tournament Tator Days weekend and a Pepsi food truck will be at the Lake Eagle Park for this event.
 - There was minimal interest in a kick ball tournament as part of Tator Days; therefore, this event may be cancelled.
8. Recap of the Rec on the GO! Kickoff Event at Lake Eagle Park on June 19th
 - Approximately 30-40 children attended, and 100 hotdogs were served.
 - The Park Board expressed interest in hosting a similar event without the meal to allow for working families to attend a Rec on the GO! event.
9. Outdoor Movie: September 6th at Eagle Lake Elementary
 - Mark calendars for this event. The movie will be Cloudy with a Chance of Meatballs.
 - There will be a free meal and the Park Board may be asked to serve the meal.

Business:

1. Splash Pad, Jake Schrom and Jamie Sorensen

- Jake Schrom and Jamie Sorensen asked if there was interest from the park board for them to look into details of what it would take to bring a splash pad to Eagle Lake. They have met with the City of Mapleton who recently installed a 30 x 30-foot splash pad and needed accessory building and obtained their construction costs.
- Discussion included the need to determine annual and long-term maintenance costs. City liability/risk would need to be determined. Appropriate location would need to be determined.

- Lisa Pottenger may be a good contact for information that has been previously gathered.

2. Recap of Outdoor Movie Event and Feedback for Future Events

- An estimated 250 people attended this event held at the school, which was a good location.
- Recommendations for next event would be to move activities and meal to 6:00 pm and to play a more current movie title.

3. Music in the Park Grant Request

- A grant has been submitted to Southern MN Initiative Foundation (SMIF). If funds are awarded Council Member Garrett Steinberg will organize music in the park events.
- If grant funding is not received it would be possible to offer these events on a smaller scale.

4. Winter Park Event and Coordination with Kim Daschner and the Shop Local Holiday Campaign

- A meeting will be set up for Bridget Larson, Administrator Bromeland, and Kim Daschner to meet to determine if joint activities can be held promoting shopping locally during the holiday season and a community type event.
- Another winter event promoting the city parks was discussed which included ideas such as snowshoeing, sledding, boot hockey and regular hockey.

5. Eagle Heights Playground Equipment

- Administrator Bromeland will be sending a letter to the Eagle Heights residents informing them of the status of a playground in Eagle Heights.
- After reviewing the rendering of proposed playground equipment, a subcommittee decided to meet to look into all options for playground equipment, matching funds and discounts from various companies to ensure the best pricing can be obtained.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was presented.

Business:

1. **Winter Event at Lake Eagle Park.** Discussion took place to determine if there is an interest in coordinating a park board event with the shop local holiday campaign the weekend before Thanksgiving. The consensus of the Park Board is to focus efforts on a winter event with information about the winter event being included in the shop local holiday mailer. The Park Board will host winter activities such as sledding, boot hockey, and more on Saturday, February 8th, from 2:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m. at Lake Eagle Park with hot chocolate and cookies being served in the warming house. Information about the February 8th event will be included in the upcoming holiday shop local mailer. Park Board members suggested creating a Facebook event so that community members can be notified if the event is canceled and rescheduled due to weather. Planning for the winter event will continue at each of the monthly meetings leading up to the February 8th event.
2. **Eagle Heights Playground Equipment.** The subcommittee (tasked with researching playground equipment options and pricing) comprised of Bridget Larson, Ryan Short, and Beth Rohrich reported preliminary findings to the Park Board. The subcommittee recommends sending aerial photos of each of the parks to selected vendors as well as inviting the vendors to visit each location when developing renderings. The consensus of the Park Board is to hold off on sending a communication to Eagle Heights residents until more information is known as most know that the Park Board is currently researching playground equipment options. Park Board Member Jeremy Horkey referenced the Fairmont Adventure Park as a possible model when contemplating fundraising various equipment items at different price points. The Park Board indicated that it would like to work with the Eagle Lake Community Development Foundation as a conduit for collecting donations and grant dollars.
3. **2020 Preliminary Park Board Funding Allocation.** Staff reported that \$50,000 was allocated in the 2020 budget for playground equipment and other improvements. Discussion took place regarding carrying over unused funds in this line item in the budget at the end of 2019 and reserving approximately \$16,000 of this amount to be used to resurface the tennis courts in 2020. Public Works Director Brian Goettl will schedule the resurfacing now to occur in the the spring of 2020. Staff reported that an email was received from resident and pickleball enthusiast Don Schroeder thanking the park board and public works department for striping the court this summer and reiterated the need to resurface the tennis courts in 2020.
4. **Feedback from Park Board about Immediate Maintenance and Equipment Needs at Parks.** The Park Board would like to devote the upcoming November 14th meeting as a work session to review immediate maintenance and equipment needs at the parks as well as discuss developing a master plan for the parks.
5. **City Website and Park Board Email.** The Park Board would like to create a parks page on the website with pictures and a description of each of the parks. City staff recently set up an email for residents to contact the City with any park related questions or concerns. The email will go to staff in the front office and the Park Board Chair.

3. Parks Master Plan and Immediate Maintenance and Equipment Needs

A brainstorming session was held to determine future needs for city parks.

a. Eagle Heights Park

- Need to determine grading needs for the park development and equipment location.
- Subcommittee is working with two vendors on equipment options.

b. Lake Eagle Park

- Relocate disc golf to more accessible areas of the park. May consider multiple locations throughout the park(s).
- Make pond more accessible, small boardwalk/bridge.
- Gazebo on top of hill, there is a path in that area, but there are only park benches and tables in grass.
- Dog Park improvements – sod or seed bare areas, bring in obstacles for dogs.
- Fix pavilion – current one leans.
- Use space on north end of park, possibly a pavilion gathering space or additional parking. More parking is needed.
- Add charcoal grill(s) by pavilion.
- Fix fence by opening on big ball field outfield. Dangerous exposed concrete for ball players
- Expand the lighting to additional areas.
- The entrance via Owl Lane has growth/trees growing up through the trail.
- Lack of concessions – discussion included that MAYBA would not utilize concession stands and the cost of a structure may be more than the use would be worth.
- Need to clean up adventure park – discussion included that this area is not being utilized by residents.
- Fix warning track. Discussion included contacting MAYBA to see if this is something they would do.
- Not enough bleachers.
- Look at all-inclusive surface at playground.
- Extending the path in the adventure park to the minimum maintenance road through the utilization of an easement.

c. Fraze Park

- Replace older playground equipment
- Concrete path to flagpole just ends, connect the two paths
- Enlarge basketball court
- Maintain volleyball courts

- Add lights to this park.
 - Fence along railroad tracks.
- d. Pond along Highway 14
- Interest was expressed in exploring the option of making this pond more appealing as a fishing area.
 - It was stated that this pond is not city property and not within city limits.
